IN THE MATTER OF :

Inaction/failure of the respondents to protect the Ichamoti river/Boropit, from encroachment and earth filling and a direction upon the respondents to stop implementation of development project within Ichamoti River/Boropit at Balu Upazila under District Pabna.

G R O U N D S -

- I. For that the duty and responsibility vested upon the respondents to serve the people and initiate lawful steps and they are also duty bound to obey the provisions of law. But the respondents have failed to perform the duties and responsibility as vested upon them and by way of violating the provision of law the earth filling is continuing in Ichamoti river, which is illegal. Hence direction may be given upon the respondents to stop encroachment and earth filling in the Ichamoti river at Bera Upazila, District- Pabna.
- II. For that disregard to laws and legal provisions and failure to ensure proper implementation of laws the respondents have caused enough damage to the environment and the local peoples are adversely affecting to the right to life. Under these circumstances the respondents are legally bound to protect the Ichamoti river in accordance with law.
- III. For that under Section 5 of the gnvbMix, wefvMxq kni I †Rjv kn‡ii †cŠi GjvKvmn †‡ki mKj †cŠi GjvKvi †Ljvi gvV Db‡y³ †vb, D‡vb Ges cÖvK...wZK Rjvavi msi‡b AvBb, 2000, also prohibits change of the nature of any land that has been earmarked as a natural reservoir. As per section 8 of the Act 2000 any person who acts in contravention of the Act is liable to imprisonment not exceeding 5 years or a fine not exceeding Taka 50,000 or both. In spite of that provision of law the respondents are encroaching in Ichamoti river. Hence a direction may be given to stop earth filling in the Ichamoti river at Bera Upazila , District- Pabna.

Wherefore, it is most humbly prayed that your Lordships would graciously be pleased to :-

a) Issue a Rule Nisi calling upon the Respondents to show cause as to why inaction/failure of the respondents to protect the Ichamoti river/Boropit, should not be declared illegal and without lawful authority and why a direction should not be given upon the respondents to stop earth filling and illegal encroachment and implementation of development project within Ichamoti River/Boropit at Balu Upazila under District Pabna.

AND

Why a direction should not be given upon the respondent no. 5-6 to remove all earth filling from the river Ichamoti/Boroit at their own cost which was done by them in the name of implementation of a project.

b) Pending hearing of the rule direct the respondent no. 3-9 to stop all kinds of earth filling, encroachment and implementation of development project within the river Ichamoti/Boropit at Bera Upazila, District-Pabna, within 48 hours and submit a compliance report within two weeks before this court.

Present Status

The case was filed and moved by Advocate Manzill Murshid, President, HRPB. After hearing the parties the Hon'ble Court issued Rule Nisi upon the respondents and granted ad-interim order. The matter is pending before the Hon'ble High Court Division.
